Supplies and Equipment

Books:

- All students will be given a school copy of Simple Steps to Beginning Percussion
 - o Any damage to books must be paid for at the end of the year.
- All students will be given a percussion pass-off book that is theirs to keep.

Pencil (No Pens)

Instruments and Supplies:

- Concert Snare Drum Sticks
 - Must be Vic Firth SD-1 General
- Practice Pad
- Bell Kit with soft rubber mallets

<u>Note</u>: Practice Pad, Bell Kit, sticks, and mallets are often sold as a set. These items are used for practice purposes so there is no need to purchase an extremely expensive kit. Often, you can find the best deals on Amazon or other online source by searching for "bell kit". The sticks in these sets sometimes are not adequate, but you can easily buy the Vic Firth SD-1 drumsticks for not very much.

- Digital Metronome (**for home use**; great **free** online and mobile app options are available)
- Music Stand (<u>not required</u>; for home use only; wire stand recommended for price)

What Do You Need to Bring to School?

- Students will work on practice pad one week and mallets the next week. This will be communicated in class.
 - Students should bring necessary mallets on mallet weeks.
 - Students should bring their practice pad and sticks on practice pad weeks.

Fees

Class Fee - \$12 (paid with student fees)

Instrument Use - \$35 (paid with student fees)

• Students will use \$10,000s worth of school percussion instruments throughout the year. This fee goes towards providing and maintaining these instruments and necessary equipment.

Lost Book - \$30

Grading Policy

Playing Skills (60%)

- Playing Tests/Pass-offs (50%)
 - Students will be required to complete 2-4 pass-offs each term.
 - o Pass-offs will take place during class on most days.
 - Students must receive a minimum score to move on to the next pass-off.
 - Retakes will happen during class.
 - Before retaking a test students must complete at least 30 practice repetitions on that exercise and turn in a parent-signed retake form to Mr. Werner.
 - Occasionally, students may be asked to play a portion of their concert music to check their preparation.
- Practice Logs (10%)
 - Students will have their practice log checked on the last day of class for the week (either Thursday or Friday).
 - Students are expected to complete multiple repetitions of method book, technique, and concert music assignment.
 - In addition to practice students must listen to at least one song performed by a professional musician who plays their instrument. A list of musicians can be found on the back of the practice log. Recordings can be found on YouTube.
 - Late practice logs will still receive credit for the number of repetitions completed.

Theory Assignments (20%)

- Note name and fingering pass-offs, rhythm tests, and written activities completed in class.
- Students must receive a minimum score to move on to the next pass-off.
 - Retakes will happen during PLUS on NG Days (Wednesdays and Thursdays) and before/after school.
- The following apps can be purchased at home for additional practice (not required):
 - o NinGenius (Student Version \$0.99): Instrument fingering and note naming.
 - Musictheory.net (Free)/Tenuto App (\$3.99): Music theory and note name practice.
- DVD Assignments:
 - There will be some DVD's shown in class during the school year. These lessons are designed to help students gain an understanding of musicians' and composers' lives, musical concepts, and view outstanding performances.

Performances (20%)

- Performance is one of the National and State Curriculum Standards for learning music.
 Students are expected to attend and participate in all performances and demonstrate great concert etiquette.
 - All students must arrive 30 minutes before the concert to warm-up.
- The Centennial Middle School Band is a group where each person is important. Each day is spent learning how to play as a group as we listen, tune, and balance to others. Absence of one individual makes a big difference in this process.
 - Absences will only be excused for major events (i.e. weddings, funerals, etc.) and illness. Notification must be provided at least 30 days prior to the concert or

rehearsal so an appropriate make-up assignment can be given and parts can be reassigned if necessary.

- Because percussionists meet in a separate class, at least one mandatory after school rehearsal will be held before each performance.
 - It is so important that each student is at the after school rehearsal. This experience cannot be accomplished by practicing more on your own, since it is our only chance to practice with all of the parts together. Consequently, there is no make-up available.
- Rehearsal and performance dates are provided in a different document.
- Concert Dress:
 - Ladies: White blouse with a black skirt/hose or pants and socks/shoes.
 - o Men: White dress shirt with a tie and black pants/socks/shoes.
 - No denim, No T-shirts, No sandals, No bare feet/legs.
