



## 2019-2020 Middle School Fees

The Provo City School District Board of Education, with the assistance of the administrators at each middle school, annually reviews and approves student fees according to Utah state law. The Board of Education requires set fees across schools to provide equity and consistency across the district. However, some fees may vary depending on individual school needs and class offerings. In conjunction with this fee sheet, individual middle schools will include fee amounts in annual registration materials and on their website. The fees below represent the maximum fee allowed per activity at any Provo City School District middle school. Some activities may provide optional individual fundraising opportunities to help offset the cost of an activity. Individual fundraising is not required, but the total cost of the activity will be the responsibility of the student/parent if no fundraising option is chosen. For activities that require fees, tryouts must be concluded and the participants selected before fees are assessed.

Note: Pursuant to Utah Code 53A-11-102 and Utah Administrative Rule R277-494-3, students who attend a charter school, private school or home school and participate in extracurricular activities must pay a \$75.00 fee in addition to all related participation fees.

Fees will be waived in accordance with the Utah State Board of Education standards for students whose parents or legal guardians verify evidence of inability to pay. Inability to pay is defined as those who are in state custody, foster care, or receiving public assistance in the form of Aid for Dependent Children, Supplemental Security Income, or are eligible according to Income Eligibility Guidelines July 1, 2019 to June 30, 2020. Case-by-case determinations are made by school administrators for those who do not qualify under one of the foregoing standards, but who, because of extenuating circumstances such as, but not limited to, exceptional financial burdens, loss of substantial reduction of income or extraordinary medical expenses, are not reasonably capable of paying the fee. (The receipt of unemployment compensation and/or reduced price school lunch does not constitute public assistance as defined above.)
