- a. From a school board member newsletter: "School community councils will send in their safe routes plans and any requests by the end of November each year. Then the district will send the requests on to the city, who then will study the issues. They will get back to the district and schools by March to let us know if they can do anything about the requests. This process gives the city enough time to then add any projects to their budget for the next fiscal year."
- b. In the meantime, perhaps we need to provide some sort of review for students who walk so they know the safest routes to take -- or even how to cross a street safely/correctly?

TRUST LANDS FUNDS:
