Chairman Dan Jensen welcomed everyone to the meeting. He asked for the minutes from last meeting to be voted on. Josie Esplin made the motion to approve the November Community Council minutes. Justine Dorton seconded the motion. All approved.

Dan asked Kyle to report on ways to allocate Trustland Funds for 2019-2020. Here are the areas Kyle thought would benefit the students the most:

-We have a \$13,000.00 commitment to pay on our **Site License for Reading Plus** for next year. This reading program has been proven to increase students reading levels. We have used it the past two years and have seen students reading levels improve.

-Last year we used Trustland Funds to **hire Instructional Aides and ESOL Aides**. These aides are used to track students that are not showing academic growth. Aides help keep students on track, one on one help with students, helping small groups of students, and assisting teachers in the classroom. The ESOL Aides are very helpful. They are used to help the ESOL students understand and carry out assignments.

-**Chromebooks** will need to be replaced. These are used in the classrooms everyday. They are essential in helping the teachers in the classroom.

When deciding on how to use the Trustland Funds, Kyle thought these are the main items that would benefit the students.

A discussion was held about these items. Everyone seemed to agree these are good things that would help the students.

Other possibilities were brought up, such as: hiring more teachers; activity based learning; and talking to the PTA about ideas they may have about using Trustland Funds.
